



**THE AIKEN COUNTY “NO MORE HOMELESS PETS”  
SPAY AND NEUTER PROGRAM  
INFORMATION SHEET**

**Objective:** To help reduce the unwanted pet population and to help reduce the number of animals euthanized at the shelter.

**Who Qualifies?** Residents of Aiken County whose incomes fall within HUD Income Guidelines.

Example: Family of 3 with a total yearly income of \$37,500 or less would be eligible for the program.								

**How does the Aiken County Spay and Neuter Program work?** An individual fills out an Application with basic questions about ownership, address, type of animal, description, etc. **The applicant signs the form testifying that their income falls within the Income Qualifications.** If qualified, the applicant receives a Voucher to have the animal(s) sterilized at an Aiken County veterinarian of the owner’s choice.

The owner calls the veterinarian of choice for an appointment for the surgery. After surgery, the veterinarian will submit the Voucher to the County for reimbursement according to surgery fee schedule.

**What does the program provide?** Aiken County will provide a “not to exceed” fee for sterilization surgery. **Charges above the “not to exceed” value shall be the responsibility of the owner.** If the animal is required to stay overnight or if there are complications, an additional \$20 per animal is authorized.

**NOT TO EXCEED SURGERY REIMBURSABLE FEES**

The veterinarian/clinic is required to obtain proof that the animal has received its state-mandated rabies shot, and, if not, to vaccinate the animal. The veterinarian/clinic is also required to offer the option of microchipping the animal.

**What do you do after the Application is completed?** The owner brings the completed Application to the Aiken County Animal Shelter at 333 Wire Road, Aiken, SC 29801. The ACAS will be able to process completed forms from 9am-12pm and 1pm- 4:30pm, Monday-Friday.

After verification of County residency, the owner receives an approved “Voucher” worth a certain value based on the type of surgery to be performed.

**What do you do with the voucher?** The owner calls Aiken County veterinarian/clinic of his/her choice to make an appointment for the surgery. The owner gives the completed voucher that has been approved by the Aiken County Animal Shelter Manager to the veterinarian/clinic.
